Language of instruction

English

Language requirements

Minimum recommended level of English proficiency: 'B2' of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR). In order to successfully participate in our courses an advanced level of English is necessary. Students do not need to provide a proof of language proficiency. Instead, we kindly ask students to take responsibility for having a sufficient knowledge of English prior to their studies at FPN.

September - January (max. 32 ECTS) (Period 1, 2, 3)

February - July (max. 32 ECTS) (Period 4, 5, 6)
or

February - June (max. 26 ECTS) (Period 4, 5)

September - July (max. 60 ECTS)
or

September - June (max. 54 ECTS)

Introduction week

FPN's introduction week entails educational activities and attending is - without any exceptions - **mandatory**.

The introduction week for fall and full-year students is from Monday 29/8/2022 up to and including Friday 2/9/2022.

The introduction week for spring students is from Tuesday 31/1/2023 up to and including Friday 3/2/2023.

Passing IPN1131 + IPN1123 + IPN1138 will be credited with 2 ECTS.

Important note:

If you want to take a resit (= second chance to pass the exam) you have to be present in Maastricht to take part at the scheduled day/time/location. If you have already returned to your home country the resit will not be faxed, sent or e-mailed to your home university.

On a different note: it is equally important to know that if you still have to take exams of your home university it is not possible to take them here in Maastricht. You either go back and take them at home, or you make arrangements to take the exams in your own country before you come to Maastricht (which is not an excuse to miss the introduction days).

Application procedure

If your home university has a formal exchange agreement with our faculty, you can apply for an exchange period through the IRO of your own university. All exchange students need to be nominated by their home university. Please contact the International Relations Office of your home university to be nominated for the Maastricht University Faculty of Psychology and Neuroscience exchange programme. Once your nomination is received, you will be provided with the application instructions.

Courses

In the course overview you can find all the information you need about FPN bachelor's courses, such as the course coordinator(s), learning outcomes and competences, number of ECTS, literature and prerequisites.

Course selection

When selecting courses, please note that some courses will assume knowledge of topics covered in previous courses, called prerequisites. If you do not meet these requirements, you are not allowed to select these courses. Students are responsible for making sure that they have the required knowledge to take courses that state certain prerequisites.

Course selection period

Fall / Full-Year:

1 June course selection opens

1 July course selection closes (13:00 hrs. CET)

Spring:

15 November course selection opens

29 November course selection closes

Course registration

At Maastricht University students have to register for their courses and exams. This is **not** applicable to exchange students. The FPN Education Office books the courses and exams for exchange students.
