Visa and immigration

The guidance below applies to **all incoming students** for academic year 2021-22, **including students from the EU** as freedom of movement has now ended following the UK's exit from the EU. This is accurate as of 15 January 2021. Always refer to government guidance for the latest information.

Autumn/fall exchange	Students can stay in the UK without a visa if studying for 6 months or less with the new visitor rules. This replaces the short-term study visa. Individuals who are visa nationals (see Appendix 2), have a criminal record or have previously been refused entry into the UK will need to apply for a Standard Visitor visa . Students can find out whether a visa is required and the rules pertaining to Visitor rules or the Standard Visitor visa here .
Full year exchange	Students studying in the UK for 6 months or longer will need to apply for a visa under the Student route as part of the new points-based system. The application system is now open, and the visa can be applied for up to six months in advance. Individuals will need to demonstrate that they meet specific requirements. More information about fees, documentation and rules regarding this route can be found here .
